

LOCAL PROPOSAL LANGUAGE FOR NOVEMBER 6, 2018 GENERAL ELECTION

TEKONSHA TOWNSHIP

FIRE STATION MILLAGE PROPOSAL A

Shall Tekonsha Township impose an increase of 1.8 mills (\$1.80 per \$1,000 of taxable value) in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for thirty (30) years, 2019 through 2049, inclusive for construction of a new fire station to house the Fire Department & Marshall Area Fire Fighters Ambulance Authority, which 1.8 mills (\$1.80 per \$1,000 of taxable value) increase will raise an estimated \$90,795.65 in the first year the millage is levied.

FIRE STATION MILLAGE PROPOSAL B

Shall Tekonsha Township impose an increase of 1.6 mills (\$1.60 per \$1,000 of taxable value) in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for thirty (30) years, 2019 through 2049, inclusive for construction of a new fire station to house the Fire Department only, which 1.6 mills (\$1.60 per \$1,000 of taxable value) increase will raise an estimated \$80,707.25 in the first year the millage is levied.

OLIVET COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

(Clarence, Convis and Lee Townships)

OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Olivet Community Schools, Eaton and Calhoun Counties, Michigan, be increased by 2.5 mills (\$2.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 8 years, 2018 to 2025, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2018 is approximately \$710,000 (this millage is to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963 and will be levied only to the extent necessary to restore that reduction)?
